Re: LD 209, An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations from the General Fund and Other Funds for the Expenditures of State Government and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2025

Pursuant to Joint Rule 314, on Wednesday, January 22, the Joint Standing Committee on Education & Cultural Affairs attended the joint public hearing on matters under their jurisdiction in LD 209, An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations from the General Fund and Other Funds for the Expenditures of State Government and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2025. Immediately following the public hearing, the committee convened a work session to vote on each initiative.

The attached report-back template reflects the votes of the members present in the room and those that recorded their votes with the committee analyst the following day.¹ Each vote is recorded as the number of committee members in favor of moving the initiative "IN" to the supplemental budget or "OUT" of the supplemental budget. The committee did not vote to amend or recommend any new initiatives; however, each caucus wishes to express additional sentiments as follows:

Representatives Brennan and Mitchell recorded absentee votes after the work session.

Members of the Democratic caucus wish to emphasize, in regard to initiative #79 related to Education in the Unorganized Territory (EUT), that the purpose of this line item is to bring the EUT into compliance with both federal and state law.

Members of the Republican caucus note that, due to the truncated timeframe set for committee reports to AFA, they did not receive data they requested related to the retroactivity of a position reclassification, nor did they receive data about per-student scholarship amounts for the Free Community College program.

In regard to allocations for paid family medical leave premiums (inits. 258, 231, and language Part E), members of the Republican caucus are concerned with the impact on taxpayers to cover the 1% costs, as well as with setting a precedent of yearly 1% funding for employee premiums in future budget bills.

Members of the Republican caucus are generally opposed to the Free Community College program due to its costliness but also express concern with the broad eligibility for high school graduates from any location to be able to access free college in Maine.

Finally, members of the Republican caucus feel that promotions or any other reorganizations that lead to position reclassifications should not be granted by the Bureau of Human Resources without authorized funds allocated for that position. The members are unwilling to support increases in funding for positions until savings are booked for the 1,500 unfilled positions in state government.
