RE:	Recommendations on the Governor's Proposed Supplemental Budget, LD 209

On January 27, 2025, the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs reviewed the two items that are not reclassifications, reorganizations, or adjustments based on revenue forecasting projections in the Governor's proposed supplemental budget pertaining to the agencies under the committee's jurisdiction. Representative Gramlich was absent from the entire work session and Representatives Terry, Frost, Hymes and Fredericks were absent for portions of the work session. All other members were present for the entirety. Please find attached the supplemental budget report-back document, which indicates the committee's vote on each of the two initiatives.

The following initiative was supported by a majority of members present and voting:

1. Ref. #255: This initiative provides funding for the increase in election ballot printing, postage and other election costs in the amount of \$408,431.

The following initiative was opposed by a majority of members present and voting:

2. Ref. #253: This initiative provides funding for increases in technology costs in accordance with MaineIT increases in the amount of \$19,838.

In regards to this initiative, the committee attempted to gather more information on the source of these cost increases and why such increases, which are billed to the department based on rates set by MaineIT, which is within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, are unanticipated and therefore result in supplemental budget requests. The committee was unable to

receive this information during the brief report back period. Therefore, the committee would strongly recommend that the Appropriations and Financial Affairs Committee inquire more directly into this issue with the Department of Administrative and Financial Affairs, MaineIT before considering this initiative.

The duties of this position have evolved and expanded, and are anticipated to continue expanding, to meet, new Army National Guard/Department of Defense (ARNG/DoD) requirements concerning Tribal consultation and Environmental Justice, increases in ARNG/DoD requirements concerning PFAS in Maine Army National Guard drinking water supplies, an increase in requirements to operate public drinking water supplies as the Maine Army National Guard builds out the Woodville Training Site, and a doubling of facilities subject to storm water regulation in the last 10 years, a trend that will continue upward.
