

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP or HEAP)



The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP or HEAP) is a grant funded by the US Department of Health and Human Services and is administered by MaineHousing in collaboration with Maine's Community Action Agencies.

The grant provides funding for fuel assistance benefits and other programs such as the Emergency Crisis Intervention Program, the Central Heating Improvement Program, and Weatherization.

LIHEAP



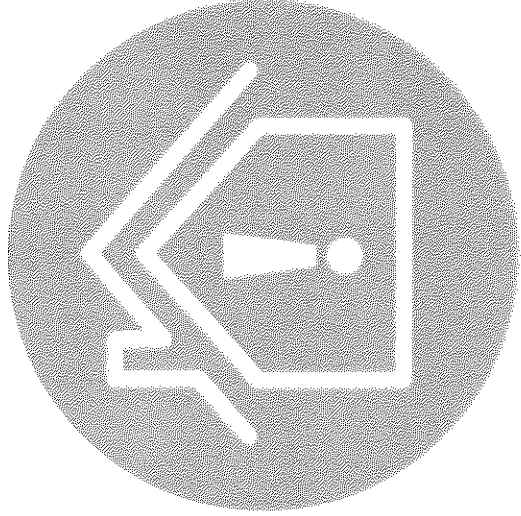
- The fuel assistance program provides a one-time annual benefit to help a household with a portion of their energy cost.
- Households may apply online or with their local Community Action Agency.
- Eligibility for HEAP provides access to other programs such as the Energy Crisis Intervention Program, the Central Heating Improvement Program, and Weatherization.

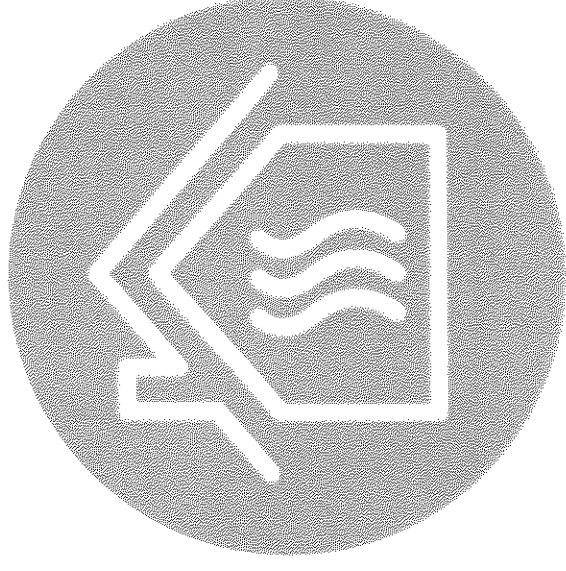


- The Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP) provides emergency fuel assistance for households to avert energy crisis.
- The program prioritizes households that have no heat.

- The Central Heating Improvement Program (CHIP) provides grants to households to repair or replace their heating systems.
- The program prioritizes households that have no heat.

- The Weatherization component provides additional funding necessary to complete weatherization projects funded by DOE's Weatherization Program.
- The services provided include insulation, weather stripping, and safety related repairs.
