EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND

This report is submitted by the Department of Health and Human Services (the Department) to the Joint Standing Committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over Municipal General Assistance matters in accordance with 22 M.R.S. §4327, subsection 6 and Public Law 2023, chapter 575, section 7.

The report presents statewide General Assistance (GA) utilization data, municipal engagement, training participation metrics, technical assistance and hotline activity, complaint data, and relevant poverty and public benefit indicators. It also includes the Department's analysis regarding the statutory 30-day General Assistance eligibility period established in 22 M.R.S. § 4310, subsection 4.

Collectively, the data and analysis provided in this report are intended to support legislative oversight of the GA program, identify statewide trends in need and program use, and inform policy discussions related to program administration, duration of eligibility, and municipal-state collaboration.

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to provide the Legislature with a comprehensive overview of the General Assistance program activity during the reporting period and to summarize key trends, observations, and administrative considerations identified through the Department's oversight role.

While General Assistance is administered at the municipal level, the Department is statutorily responsible for providing no-cost training, technical assistance, policy guidance, and compliance reviews to support consistent and lawful program administration statewide. This report reflects data collected through those functions and is intended to promote transparency, accountability, and informed decision-making regarding the GA program.

The sections that follow present quantitative data and analysis related to municipal engagement, assistance categories, and program utilization, along with contextual information relevant to the Department's assessment of the statutory 30-day eligibility period.

General Assistance is a municipally administered, locally operated program that serves as Maine's safety-net program of last resort for individuals and households who lack the means to meet their basic needs. Each municipality is responsible for determining eligibility, issuing assistance, and administering the program in accordance with state statute and Department policy.

General Assistance does not provide cash assistance to applicants. Instead, assistance is issued in the form of vouchers or vendor payments for basic necessities, including but not limited to:

- Housing and shelter
- Utilities
- Food
- Household and personal necessities
- Diapers and other essential items

Municipalities initially fund assistance issued under the GA program and may then seek reimbursement from the Department. Under current law, municipalities are eligible for 70 percent reimbursement of allowable General Assistance expenditures, subject to compliance with statutory and policy requirements.

The Department does not administer individual GA cases or make eligibility determinations. Its role is limited to training, technical assistance, policy guidance, and compliance oversight, as authorized by statute. The structure of the program reflects a shared responsibility model, with municipalities providing direct assistance and the State supporting consistency, reimbursement, and oversight.

DATA SOURCES AND METHODOLOGY

The Department used the following sources to generate this report:

- Municipal General Assistance reimbursement reports submitted to the Department
 - Reports were received between July 1, 2025, and December 12, 2025.
 - Reports were received by 153 municipalities.
- Department administrative records related to GA hotline activity, and complaints
- Additional metrics identified by the Department as necessary to support legislative oversight

During the reporting period, General Assistance supported 18,563 individuals across 12,717 households statewide. An average household size could not be calculated based on the available data.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM UTILIZATION METRICS

A. Individuals and Families Served

Between July 1, 2025 and December 12, 2025, General Assistance supported 18,563 individuals across 12,717 households statewide. An average household size could not be calculated based on the available data.

B. Basic Necessities Funded

Housing and shelter assistance accounted for the largest share of General Assistance, with 97.1% of households receiving housing-related support, followed closely by utilities and household and personal needs.

C. Duration of Assistance

Current statute requires the Department to maintain a centralized General Assistance database capable of tracking recipients statewide, including duration of assistance. The Department is unable to create this database with existing resources. To resolve this statutory requirement that cannot be operationally or fiscally met, the Department has submitted [LD 1996](#) in the 132nd Legislature to remove the database requirement and adjust reporting requirements.

MUNICIPAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND OVERSIGHT

Since July 1, 2025, the Department has focused its municipal technical assistance efforts on statewide training for General Assistance administrators. The Department has hosted five General Assistance Fundamentals training courses, incorporating new legislatively required content on trauma-informed services and culturally and linguistically appropriate care.

Between July 1 and the date of this report, 270 individual administrators have completed GA Fundamentals training, representing 223 municipalities and territories statewide. These Department-led trainings are provided at no cost to municipalities and are designed to ensure consistent understanding of statutory requirements, administrative standards, and evolving legislative expectations.



The Department continues to prioritize direct training as a core component of municipal support and oversight, ensuring administrators receive timely, accurate guidance aligned with current law and policy.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE HOTLINE ACTIVITY

The General Assistance Hotline serves as a centralized point of contact for municipal officials, applicants, advocates, and other members of the public seeking information about GA program requirements, eligibility standards, and administrative procedures. The hotline provides real-time support and clarification on statute and policy, promoting consistent program administration across municipalities, and helps ensure timely access to accurate information for both administrators and individuals seeking assistance. The hotline is available toll-free via telephone or electronically via email.

Between July 1, 2024, and December 12, 2025, the GA hotline handled 8,162 inquiries, with over 91% originating from municipal officials, underscoring the hotline's role as a primary support resource for local GA administration.

COMPLAINTS RECEIVED

During the reporting period of July 1, 2025, through December 12, 2025, the Department received 74 Municipality of Responsibility (MOR) related inquiries and complaints. The majority (72) were classified as MOR Level 1, representing routine inquiries seeking clarification on which municipality was responsible for providing assistance. Only 2 cases rose to MOR Level 2, involving disputes or complaints from applicants or General Assistance Administrators regarding responsibility determinations. Cases at MOR Level 2 involve Department mediation and guidance to municipalities regarding the responsible municipal party. No cases required Department intervention at the MOR Level 3 threshold. Overall, the data indicates that most MOR issues were resolved through guidance and clarification without the need for formal intervention.

POVERTY DATA

To satisfy the statutory requirement to include information regarding municipal poverty levels and the use of other public benefit programs, this report relies on publicly available data sources rather than duplicating data that is readily accessible to the Legislature and the public.

Poverty data is derived from the U.S. Census Bureau, which provides municipal, county, and regional poverty estimates statewide. ANALYSIS OF THE 30-DAY ELIGIBILITY PERIOD

The Department evaluated whether an extension of the General Assistance eligibility period beyond the current 30-day limit established in 22 M.R.S. § 4310(4) is warranted. Based on the data reviewed, the Department does not recommend extending the current 30-day eligibility period.

The existing eligibility duration provides important flexibility for households experiencing frequent or unstable changes in housing and financial circumstances. Shorter eligibility periods allow municipalities to reassess needs as they arise and to provide assistance responsively rather than as a single, extended determination.

Regular in-person contact associated with shorter eligibility periods supports ongoing engagement between applicants and municipal administrators. This approach helps mitigate service gaps that can occur when assistance is granted for longer periods without interim reassessment, reducing the risk that households experience a sudden loss of support following an extended eligibility window.

Additionally, the current framework allows municipalities to provide assistance incrementally, aligning support with evolving circumstances and preventing discontinuation of abrupt service. Based on these considerations, the Department finds that the existing 30-day eligibility period appropriately balances flexibility, oversight, and continuity of assistance.

CONCLUSION

The information presented in this report reflects both the scale and complexity of General Assistance administration statewide. High participation in Department-led trainings and continued reliance on technical assistance resources demonstrate the critical role of clear guidance and ongoing support for municipal officials. Assistance data further illustrates that GA remains a vital safety net, with housing, utilities, household needs, food, and diapers representing the most frequently utilized categories.

While progress has been made in strengthening training, consistency, and compliance, the data also underscores the importance of sustained oversight, communication, and collaboration between the Department and municipalities. Ongoing monitoring, education, and technical assistance will remain essential to reducing repeat issues, supporting effective administration, and ensuring that eligible households receive assistance in accordance with statute and policy.

The Department remains committed to continuous improvement of the GA program and to working collaboratively with municipal partners to uphold program integrity while meeting the basic needs of Maine residents.
