Statement of Fact

This financial order will allot funds to allow the Department of Environmental Protection to fulfill the grant award obligations for the State Revolving Fund program as approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. These funds will be disbursed to the Maine Municipal Bond Bank to meet the match requirement for the wastewater treatment plant grant projects. Failure to approve this financial order would preclude the State from meeting the match requirement and potentially lose \$12,424,000 in federal capitalization funds for the State Revolving Fund program.

Statement of Fact

The Maine Public Utilities Commission received a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) for a 1200MW transmission line, Docket 2017-00232. A filing fee covering the Commission's costs was received by the Commission from the utility proposing the CPCN, in this case the Central Maine Power Company. Pursuant to Maine Statute, in determining the public need for a CPCN, the Commission shall take into account the costs and benefits of the proposed transmission line, system reliability, and other matters. The Commission contracted with London Economics for expert consulting services to assist in the review of the CPCN. This \$187,660 allotment will be used to encumber the fiscal year 2018-19 portion of the agreement. (CT 65A 20171207*1907)

Failure to approve this financial order will have a detrimental impact on the program resulting in the inability of the Commission to provide sufficient analysis and review of the CPCN, thus potentially causing adverse consequences in terms of cost and reliability for Majze consumers.

The Commission will contract for expert consulting services to assist in the review of the NTA. This \$85,600 allotment will be used to encumber the consulting contract.

Failure to approve this financial order will have a detrimental impact on the program resulting in the inability of the Commission to provide sufficient analysis and review of the NTA, thus potentially causing adverse consequences in terms of cost and reliability for Maine consumers.
