



Capitol Police

- Law Enforcement Agency that is part of the Department of Public Safety.
- A Capitol Police Officer is stationed at the State House kiosk whenever the State House is open to the public.
- Police Officers patrol all State property in Augusta and also maintain a 24/7 presence at Riverview Psychiatric Center
- CP Watchpersons also patrol overnight.



Special Hours

- When the House, the Senate or committees are meeting (after normal hours).
- Doors that are unlocked until meetings are done:
 - State House 1st floor
 - West Entrance facing office building
 - Connector
 - Office Building 2nd floor
 - West Entrance facing Sewall St.
 - East Entrance facing the State House
 - Committee Room(s)



Screening

- Weapons prohibited since at least 1988.
- The Legislative Council approved the routine screening for weapons in 2010.
- Legislators, staff, and employees can use their access cards to bypass screening – <u>weapons are still prohibited</u>.
- The public, guests, and anyone without approved access must be screened before entering the State House.

Evacuation Plans

- When the alarm sounds
 - Do not use the elevators
 - Connector doors close
 - Fire doors close
- What to do
 - Last person out closes door
 - Follow evacuation path to exit
 - Proceed to evacuation point to be counted
- Do NOT reenter until advised by CP



They will be wearing yellow reflective vests

- Will direct people to exits

- Will assist those needing help
- Persons with disabilities meet a fire warden at the nearest stairwell

























Emergency Assistance

- Alarm Buttons
 - Duress Buttons
 - Medical Emergency Buttons
