An Act Regarding Caretakers of Ancient Burying Grounds and Access to Ancient Burying Grounds

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 1

2 Sec. 1. 13 MRSA §1101, as amended by PL 2013, c. 524, §1, is further amended 3 to read:

§1101. Maintenance and repairs; municipality 4

5 1. Grave sites of veterans in ancient burying grounds. In any ancient burying ground, as referenced in Title 30-A, section 5723, the municipality in which that burying 6 ground is located, in collaboration with veterans' organizations, cemetery associations, 7 civic and fraternal organizations, descendants of veterans buried in the ancient burying 8 ground and other interested persons, shall keep in good condition all graves, headstones, 9 monuments and markers designating the burial place of Revolutionary soldiers and 10 sailors and veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States. To the best of its ability 11 given the location and accessibility of the ancient burying ground, the municipality, in 12 collaboration with veterans' organizations, cemetery associations, civic and fraternal 13 organizations, descendants of veterans buried in the ancient burying ground and other 14 interested persons, shall keep the grass, weeds and brush suitably cut and trimmed on 15 those graves from May 1st to September 30th of each year. A municipality may 16 designate a caretaker to whom it delegates for a specified period of time the 17 municipality's responsibilities regarding an ancient burying ground. If a municipality is 18 19 unable to care for veterans' burial places in an ancient burying ground or does not 20 designate a caretaker, descendants of veterans buried in the ancient burying ground may designate a caretaker to whom is delegated for a specified period of time the 21 municipality's responsibilities regarding the ancient burying ground. The caretaker's 22 name and contact information must be registered with the municipality. 23

1-A. Grave sites of individuals who are not designated as veterans in ancient 24 burying grounds. To the best of its ability given the location and accessibility of the 25 ancient burying ground, the municipality in which an ancient burying ground is located 26 may, in collaboration with veterans' organizations, cemetery associations, civic and 27 fraternal organizations, descendants of individuals buried in the ancient burying ground 28 29 and other interested persons, keep the grass, weeds and brush suitably cut and trimmed from May 1st to September 30th of each year on all graves, headstones, monuments and 30 31 markers in the ancient burying ground not designating the burial place of Revolutionary 32 soldiers and sailors and veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States. A municipality may designate a caretaker to whom it delegates for a specified period of 33 time the municipality's functions regarding an ancient burying ground. If a municipality 34 35 is unable to care for an ancient burying ground or does not designate a caretaker, descendants of individuals buried in the ancient burying ground may designate a 36 caretaker to whom is delegated for a specified period of time the municipality's functions 37 regarding the ancient burying ground. The caretaker may, at the direction and expense of 38 the descendants, provide care and maintenance of the headstones, monuments and 39 markers in the ancient burying ground. The caretaker's name and contact information 40 must be registered with the municipality. 41

2. Grave sites of veterans in public burying grounds. A municipality, cemetery 42 corporation or cemetery association owning and operating a public burying ground shall, 43

in collaboration with veterans' organizations, cemetery associations, civic and fraternal
organizations and other interested persons, keep the grave, headstone, monument or
marker designating the burial place of any veteran of the Armed Forces of the United
States in that public burying ground in good condition and repair from May 1st to
September 30th of each year.

6 A municipality in which a public burying ground is located may, in collaboration with 7 veterans' organizations, cemetery associations, civic and fraternal organizations, 8 <u>descendants of individuals buried in the public burying ground</u> and other interested 9 persons, adopt standards of good condition and repair to which grave sites of veterans of 10 the Armed Forces of the United States must be kept. The standards at a minimum must 11 detail how to maintain the grave, grass and headstones.

- 12 If a municipality does not adopt standards, the municipality, cemetery corporation or 13 cemetery association shall apply the following standards of good condition and repair:
- 14 D. Ensure that grass is suitably cut and trimmed;
- 15 E. Keep a flat grave marker free of grass and debris; and
- 16 F. Keep the burial place free of fallen trees, branches, vines and weeds.

Sec. 2. 13 MRSA §1101-B, as amended by PL 2013, c. 421, §2 and c. 524, §3, is
further amended to read:

19 **§1101-B.** Ancient burying grounds

1. Access to ancient burying grounds. The owner of an ancient burying ground or 20 a person who owns a parcel of land that contains an ancient burying ground shall provide 21 a municipality or its the caretaker designated pursuant to section 1101 access necessary to 22 perform the duties pursuant to section 1101 and Title 30-A, section 2901. A municipality 23 or the caretaker designated pursuant to section 1101 may access an ancient burying 24 ground surrounded by privately owned land annually or as often as determined necessary 25 by the municipality or the designated caretaker to provide care and maintenance of the 26 headstones, monuments and markers so as to protect and preserve the ancient burying 27 ground. Any unreasonable denial to provide of access may result in the owner being held 28 responsible for any fines, court costs and attorney's fees incurred by municipalities in 29 legally obtaining access or for failing to meet the requirements of section 1101. 30

2. Maintenance by landowner. A person who owns a parcel of land that contains an ancient burying ground and chooses to deny access to the municipality or its the caretaker designated pursuant to section 1101 shall assume the duties as described in section 1101 and Title 30-A, section 2901, subsection 1. Maintenance of an ancient burying ground by the owner or a person who owns a parcel of land that contains an ancient burying ground exempts the municipality from performing the duties as described in section 1101.

A municipality or its <u>the</u> caretaker designated pursuant to section 1101 to carry out the municipality's functions regarding an ancient burying ground must have access to any ancient burying ground within the municipality in order to determine if the ancient burying ground is being maintained in good condition and repair. If an ancient burying

ground or a veteran's grave within an ancient burying ground is not maintained in good 1 condition and repair, the municipality may take over the care or appoint a caretaker to 2 whom it delegates the municipality's functions regarding an ancient burying ground. If a 3 municipality is unable to care for an ancient burying ground or does not appoint a 4 caretaker, descendants of individuals buried in the ancient burying ground may appoint a 5 caretaker to whom is delegated the municipality's functions regarding an ancient burying 6 ground. The caretaker's name and contact information must be registered with the 7 8 municipality.

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SUMMARY

10 This bill allows a descendant of an individual or a veteran buried in an ancient or 11 public burying ground to appoint a caretaker to maintain the burying ground when the 12 municipality is unable to care for the burying ground or to appoint a caretaker.
