# LD 1176 An Act Regarding Caretakers of Ancient Burying Grounds and Access to Ancient Burying Grounds

#### SUMMARY

This bill allows a descendant of an individual or a veteran buried in an ancient or public burying ground to appoint a caretaker to maintain the burying ground when the municipality is unable to care for the burying ground or to appoint a caretaker.

- Ensures access to ancient burying grounds;
- Protects rights of property owner

- Removes obligation on municipality when family appoints caretaker;
- Towns don't have the money to preserve and restore;
- Doesn't affect property owner's rights
