1 Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 2

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next 3 4 fiscal year; and

5 Whereas, this legislation affects obligations and expenses during the course of the 6 current fiscal year and requires immediate attention; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 7 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 8 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 9 10 therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human 11 Services shall amend its rules to increase reimbursement rates for home-based services in 12 accordance with this section. 13

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1. The department shall raise the hourly reimbursement rate by 40% for:

Attendant Care Services provided under the provisions of Chapter 101: 15 Α. MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 19, Home and Community Benefits 16 17 for the Elderly and Adults with Disabilities;

Attendant Care Services provided under the provisions of Chapter 101: 18 19 MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 96, Private Duty Nursing and Personal Care Services; 20

С. Attendant Care Services provided under the provisions of Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 12, Allowances for Consumer-22 23 Directed Attendant Services:

D. Consumer-directed Home Based Care Services provided under the provisions of 24 Chapter 14-197, Office of Aging and Disability Services, Chapter 11, Consumer-25 26 Directed Personal Assistance Services; and

E. Participant-driven Personal Support Services provided under the provisions of 27 Chapter 10-149, Office of Aging and Disability Services Policy Manual, Chapter 5, 28 29 Section 63, In-home and Community Support Services for Elderly and Other Adults.

2. The department shall raise the hourly reimbursement rate by 53.5% for: 30

A. Personal Support Services; Respite Care in the home by Certified Nurse's Aide, 31 Home Health Aide, attendant or personal support specialist; Certified Nurse's Aide -32 33 Home Health Services; and Home Health Aide - Home Health Services provided under the provisions of Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, 34 Section 19, Home and Community Benefits for the Elderly and Adults with 35 Disabilities; 36

B. Personal Support Services; Certified Nurse's Aide - Home Health Services; and 37 Home Health Aid - Home Health Services provided under the provisions of Chapter 38

101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 96, Private Duty Nursing and
Personal Care Services; and

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- C. Personal Support Services provided under the provisions of Chapter 10-149, Office of Aging and Disability Services Policy Manual, Chapter 5, Section 63, In-Home and Community Support Services for Elderly and Other Adults.
- 6 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 7 legislation takes effect when approved.

- 9 This resolve requires that the Department of Health and Human Services amend its 10 rules to increase reimbursement rates for certain specified home-based services.
