13. Request for proposals. The department shall request proposals for projects to commence June 1, 2022 to carry out the purposes of the program. The department shall select up to 10 projects from proposals submitted under this subsection. The department shall prioritize funding to a project that serves a community with high numbers or a high percentage of children who are economically disadvantaged or that effectively involves a wide variety of providers or other entities in the community including school administrative units.

14. Funding. The department shall seek and apply for available federal funds or funds from any other sources to pay the costs of the projects. To the maximum extent possible, the department shall use state funds received for the projects to maximize its receipt of federal funds to be used for the projects.'

Armend the bill in section 1 in §3931 by renumbering the subsections to read consecutively.

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 2. Report. On October 2, 2024, a community contractor whose project is selected under the First 4 ME Early Care and Education Program established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, chapter 1065 shall report to the Department of Health and Human Services on the progress toward objectives, goals and outcomes of the project detailed in the project's proposal. On or before February 1, 2025, the department shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters regarding the project reports received under this section along with any recommended legislation. The committee may report out legislation based upon the department's report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, changes the First 4 ME Early Care and Education Program from a pilot project to an ongoing program within the Department of Health and Human Services. It directs the department to seek and apply for available federal funds or funds from any other sources to pay the costs of projects under the program and provides that the department, to the maximum extent possible, must use state funds received for the projects to maximize its receipt of federal funds to be used for the projects. It also amends some of the participant qualification and provider requirements under the program.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Health and Human Services will not receive General Fund appropriations in the current biennium, since this program only commences on June 1, 2022. The department will require funding for 4 Social Service Program Specialist II positions and 3 Social Service Program Specialist I positions to manage the program and all contract requirements along with funding for contracts with up to 10 pilot project providers beginning on June 1, 2022. This funding will need to be requested as part of the SFY 2022-23 biennial budget process.
