LD 378 An Act To Temporarily Waive Renewal Fees for On-premises Retail Liquor

Licenses (Senator Luchini) - Emergency

SUMMARY

This bill, which is an emergency measure, temporarily waives the license-renewal fees for establishments licensed to sell liquor for on-premises consumption during calendar year 2021.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The chart attached to this bill analysis sets for the annual fees applicable to on-premises retail licensees.

ISSUES RAISED / AMENDMENTS PROPOSED AT PUBLIC HEARING

- ➤ BABLO Proposed Amendment Timing of fee waiver. Rather that waiving the license-renewal fees for on-premises retailers during calendar year 2021—which would require BABLO to issue refunds for any license-renewal fees paid between the beginning of the year and the effective date of this emergency legislation—BABLO proposes amending the bill to provide for waiver of license-renewal fees for one year, beginning on a specific date after the effective date of the bill.
- ➤ BABLO Proposed Amendment Extension of Licenses. Because on-premises liquor licensees were prohibited from providing dine-in service between March 18 and June 16 of 2020, as a result of the Governor's Executive Orders during the coronavirus state of emergency, BABLO reports that it has been working with on-premises retailers to extend the expiration date of their liquor licenses. BABLO suggested amending LD 378 to provide in law for such a one-time, 90-day extension of the expiration date for all on-premises liquor licenses.
- ➤ NECSEMA Proposed Amendment Off-premises retailers. The New England Convenience Store & Energy Marketers Association requested that the bill's one-year waiver of license-renewal fees be extended to establishments licensed to sell liquor for off-premises consumption.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

None.

FISCAL IMPACT

Not yet determined - but there necessarily will be a loss of licensing fee revenue.
