Any unexpended balances from this Part may not lapse but must be carried forward for the same purpose.

Those sections of this Part that set the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 and the local and state contributions for that purpose may not be construed to require the State to provide payments that exceed the appropriation of funds for general purpose aid for local schools for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022.

40	This Part does the following.
41 42 43	1. It establishes the total cost of education from kindergarten to grade 12, the state contribution, the annual target state share percentage and the mill expectation for the local contribution for fiscal year 2021-22.

2. It provides a one-year change to the State's essential programs and services education funding model in order to recognize the decline in student enrollment for the year prior to funding and, due to the unusual nature of the decline, the inability of school administrative units to reduce their costs accordingly.
