8	In accordance with this chapter and with the cooperation of the Department of
9	Transportation the Maine Turnnike Authority a statewide organization representing

11	agencies the Department of Public Safety shall develop and implement an aler system to
12	be activated on behalf of missing persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities.
13	The alert system must include standards of procedure for local law enforcement agencies

15	disability and appropriately activate an alert to local or statewide law enforcement agencies
16	and to the media, including print, radio, Internet-based communication systems and other
17	methods of communicating information to the public; a plan for providing relevant
18	information to the public through an existing system of dynamic message signs located
19	across the State when necessary; and training for all law enforcement officers. The alert
20	system must be developed and implemented using existing resources.
21	SUMMARY
22	This bill requires the Department of Public Safety to develop and implement an alert
23	system to be activated on behalf of missing persons with intellectual or developmental
24	disabilities.

SUMMARY 26 This committee amendment replaces the bill and changes its title. It updates the 27 existing Silver Alert Program within the Department of Public Safety to include missing 28endangered persons. "Missing endangered person" is defined as a person who is believed 29 to be in danger because of the person's age, mental or physical health or intellectual or 30 developmental disability, because of environmental or weather conditions or because the 31 person is missing in dangerous, unexplained, involuntary or suspicious circumstances as 32 33 determined by a local law enforcement agency.
