That the State Controller increase allotment in account 015-10A-0563-02, CARES Child Care Development Fund Block Grant, by \$13,007,557 in the All Other line category for the purpose of funding additional supports for low-income children, their families and daycare providers impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as operational costs and additional staff training; and,

Be it further ordered, that the State Controller authorize the expenditure in accordance with the attached "Revision of the Work Program for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2021", for which this shall be our sufficient warrant.

Statement of Fact

This financial order provides allotment to fund additional supports for low-income children, their families and daycare providers impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as operational costs and additional staff training. This funding will reduce the parent portion of childcare payments and reimburse childcare providers based on enrollment instead of attendance. Congress approved the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act (CRRSA) in December 2020 because of concerns that the infrastructure of daycare facilities will fail without additional assistance to compensate the adverse financial impacts of COVID-19. Funding is provided by supplemental funding within the Child Care Development Fund Block Grant.

Statement of Fact

This financial order provides funds to cover the costs of establishing a Rapid Response Team of contracted nurses who will help ensure the health and safety of the residents in congregate care settings when there are staffing shortages brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. This team of nurses will be deployed by the Department of Health and Human Services to congregate care facilities if a congregate care facility is on the verge of closure. These staffing resources may also be deployed to support the COVID-19 vaccination effort at sites across the state. This funding should help alleviate current issues with staffing and provide a short-term solution until all congregate care facility staff can be vaccinated. Funds are provided from the Coronavirus Relief Fund under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act.

This financial order also provides funding to purchase a low temperature refrigerator which will be used to maintain new and existing COVID-19 test samples. Funding is provided through Maine's existing 2019 Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity for Prevention and Control of Emerging Diseases Application grant.

Statement of Fact

This financial order provides funding to purchase a forklift which will be used at the Public Health Emergency Preparedness State Receiving, Staging, and Storage warehouse. The forklift will be used at the warehouse in direct support missions to provide critical personal protective equipment (PPE), COVID-19 testing supplies, and COVID-19 therapeutics to healthcare and non-healthcare facilities statewide and will reduce future leasing expenditures. Failure to allot these funds may lead to a disruption in Public Health Emergency Preparedness program's ability to provide critical PPE and testing supplies after the expiration of temporary COVID funding which has been used to lease additional forklifts. Funding is provided through the Cooperative Agreement for Emergency Response: Public Health Crisis Response grant.
