## DHHS Quarterly Report on Rulemaking

## Submitted to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services

(Pursuant to P.L. 2003 Chapter 689. Part A. § A-2)

P.L. 2003, c. 689, Part A. § A-2, requires the Department of Health and Human Services to submit quarterly reports on rulemaking, pursuant to:

"Sec. A-2. Quarterly report; rulemaking. Beginning October 1, 2004, the Commissioner of Health and Human Services shall provide the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters with a quarterly report that summarizes rule—making activity of the Department of Health and Human Services."

<u>About the APA:</u> The intent of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act (A.P.A.), <u>5 MRSA sec. 8001 through 11008</u> is to improve public access to agency decision-making and to increase awareness of agency rules. In Maine, the Administrative Procedure Act was adopted at the First Session of the 108th Legislature, with some amendments since. It applies uniform requirements to state agencies which have rulemaking power, and sets minimum standards for agencies to follow in adopting and implementing rules. Very generally, the A.P.A. establishes a uniform, comprehensive set of procedures covering:

- The administrative actions of state agencies, including rulemaking, advisory rulings, adjudicatory proceedings, and licensing; and
- Judicial review of those actions.

We have based our report on the format used by the Secretary of State's Office, Bureau of Corporations, Elections, and Commissions, to tally rules that are promulgated, and separately those that are proposed, for the Department of Health and Human Services.

In addition to the "subject matter" noted in the right-most column, additional summary statements for each of these rules are filed as paper-copy "basis statements" in the office of the Secretary of State's APA Coordinator, and are available for review.
