The Appropriations Committee is asking for each committee's list of priorities for items on the Special Appropriations Table. See attached PDF file and email below for context.

I've also attached an Excel spreadsheet with only ACF items for you to prioritize. As of today, there are 6 items on the table (4 carried over and 2 from the Second Regular).

In addition, I listed 7 additional bills with known fiscal notes and one with an expected fiscal note – for a total of 8. Only 3 have been reported out (856, 1744 and 1929) and the last 5 have not been reported out (174, 219, 1942, 1998 and 2013).
