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Re: EUT Bills on the Appropriations Table

The AFA Committee has requested a list of each policy committee's priorities for bills on the Appropriations Table. At this time, not all bills voted this session by EUT have received a completed fiscal analysis and not all bills with a completed fiscal analysis have yet reached the point in the process where placement on the Table might occur. Below is a list of bills for your review and prioritization based on the information that is available.

BILLS CURRENTLY ON THE TABLE

- 1. LD 245, An Act Regarding Rural Water Districts (Sen. Guerin) reported out of EUT in 2021
 - Unanimous OTP-A.
 - Transfer from Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund: FY22 \$200,000 to DHHS.
- 2. LD 551, An Act To Accelerate Weatherization Efforts in the State (Rep. Kessler) reported out of EUT in 2021
 - Majority report OTP-A (minority report ONTP)
 - Requires one-time General Fund appropriation of \$25M in FY22 to Efficiency Maine Trust
- 3. LD 1554, An Act To Provide Climate Change Transition Assistance for Maine's Energy-intensive Businesses (Rep. Wadsworth)- reported out of EUT in 2021
 - majority report OTP-A (minority report OTP-A)
 - Requires one-time General Fund appropriation of \$6M in FY22 to Efficiency Maine Trust
- 4. LD 1555, An Act To Fund Broadband Internet Infrastructure for Marginalized Groups in the State (Rep. Talbot Ross) - reported out of EUT in 2021
 - Majority report OTP-A (minority report ONTP)
 - Requires one-time General Fund appropriation of \$15M in FY22 to the Office of Broadband Development within the Department of Economic and Community Development

- 5. LD 1579, An Act To Transition State and Local Motor Vehicle Fleets to 100 Percent Zeroemission Vehicles (Sen. Vitelli)
 - Reported out of EUT 03/31/22, majority OTP-A (minority ONTP)
 - Fiscal Note General Fund Impact: potential future biennium cost increase

6. LD 1634, An Act To Create the Maine Generation Authority (Rep. Grohoski)

- Not yet reported out of EUT, minority OTP-A (majority ONTP)
- Fiscal Note General Fund Impact: potential future biennium revenue decrease

BILLS AWAITING FISCAL INFORMATION

- 7. LD 682, An Act To Ensure the Viability of the Northern Maine Electric Transmission Grid (Sen. Stewart)
 - Not yet reported out of EUT, unan. OTP-A report
 - Unclear at this time whether the amendment will require a fiscal note that would meet the requirements for placement on the Table.

8. LD 1959, An Act To Ensure Transmission and Distribution Utility Accountability (Sen. Brenner)

- Not yet reported out of EUT, three OTP-A reports.
- Unclear at this time whether the amendment will require a fiscal note that would meet the requirements for placement on the Table
