SUBJECT: Legislative Orientation Schedule: 131st Maine Legislature

Congratulations on your election to the Maine Legislature! As a newly elected or returning Legislator, you will have a challenging but rewarding opportunity to serve your constituents and the people of Maine. To assist you in acclimating to your role as Legislator, the Legislative Council has developed various legislator orientation programs for members of the 131st Legislature that will be held over the next several months.

The legislator orientation programs, sponsored by the Legislative Council, are designed to provide incoming legislators with important information regarding their responsibilities, key issues, legislative procedures and services. Some of the programs are designed for those of you who have been elected to the Legislature for the first time, and others are intended for all members of the legislature regardless of length of prior legislative service. Enclosed with this memo is a calendar that shows the orientation dates.

1. NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION

For all newly elected members and returning members who did not serve in the 130th Legislature:

Tuesday, November 15, 2022 - Virtual Presentations via Zoom

Wednesday, November 16, 2022 – State House, Augusta Group A Only (see attached list)

Thursday, November 17, 2022 – State House, Augusta **Group B Only** (see attached list)

This orientation program covers general information regarding your duties as a legislator, legislative procedures and staff services. It is also an opportunity for you to meet other newly elected members and to begin to develop working relationships that are the foundation of an effective legislative process. All of these topics are relevant to your effectiveness as a legislator, and **it** is *essential* that **newly elected members attend this orientation.** A preliminary copy of the New Member Orientation agenda is enclosed for your review. Please contact the Office of the Executive Director at 287-1615 or if you are not able to attend.

2. STATE HOUSE PARKING

Parking on the State House campus for New Member Orientation is limited, but parking lots A, B and part of C have been reserved exclusively for Legislators. <u>Signs indicate designated legislator parking areas</u> (see the campus map). **Please use the designated legislative parking areas**. You will receive special legislative plates for your vehicle during the week of December 5th.

3. MEMBERS' PAYROLL INFORMATION & OTHER FORMS

NEWLY Elected Legislators: Payroll and benefit forms must be completed in our online system by Thursday, November 17th in order for you to receive your legislative salary and expenses. An automated email with a link to the legislative onboarding system and log-in instructions was sent to your personal email address this week. Paper forms are available upon request. In addition, you must complete the enclosed Constituent Services Allowance form and either bring it with you to New Member Orientation or e-mail a signed and scanned copy to <u>dawna.lopatosky@legislature.maine.gov</u> no later than Monday, December 12, 2022.

RETURNING Legislators: You must complete the enclosed Constituent Services Allowance form and either bring it with you to Pre-Legislative Conference or e-mail a signed and scanned copy to <u>dawna.lopatosky@legislature.maine.gov</u> no later than Monday, December 12, 2022. If you have a new primary residence, or if you want to make changes to direct deposit, payroll tax withholding or benefits, please contact Sherry Davis at (207) 287-1617.

4. <u>SECURITY BADGES/PHOTOS</u>

All newly-elected legislators and returning members who did not serve in the 130th Legislature will have their photos taken for their security ID badges on their assigned day for New Member Orientation.

5. <u>PRE-LEGISLATIVE CONFERENCE & SWEARING-IN OF MEMBERS-</u> ELECT

Date: Monday-Thursday, December 5-8, 2022 State House, Augusta

The second orientation program is a program designed for both newly elected and returning Legislators. Please reserve these days on your schedule so you may attend this important conference. Several of the sessions are <u>statutorily required</u> training for all legislators.

Please note that the first day of the Pre-Legislative Conference, Monday, December 5th, is intended primarily for members who have been elected to the Legislature for the first time. On Tuesday evening, December 6th, all newly elected and re-elected members and their guests are invited to a reception and banquet at the Augusta Civic Center. Members-elect will be sworn into office on the third day of this pre-legislative conference, Wednesday, December 7th.

6. TRAVEL/LODGING

For New Member Orientation: you will be reimbursed for one round trip mileage between your home and the State House in Augusta at the State-authorized rate of \$0.46/mile. Actual toll expenses are also reimbursed. The maximum lodging reimbursement allowed is \$55. Receipts are required.

For Pre-Legislative Conference: you will be reimbursed for one round trip mileage between your home and the State House, at the State-authorized rate of \$0.46/mile. For all other travel during the week of Pre-Legislative Conference, mileage reimbursement is based on actual cost or a maximum of \$38 per day, whichever is less. Actual toll expenses are also reimbursed. The maximum lodging reimbursement allowed is \$38 and receipts are <u>not</u> required.

For those of you who reside a great distance from the State House and need to stay overnight in Augusta while attending these events, we have provided a list of several area hotels. <u>Please</u> <u>make your own reservations as soon as possible to assure a room. When reserving a</u> <u>room, you will need to request the special rate listed on the hotel page enclosed in this</u> <u>packet to receive the hotel's discounted rate.</u>

Once you have been sworn into office on Wednesday, December 7, 2022, we will issue payment to reimburse you for your travel and lodging expenses to attend the New Member Orientation and the Pre-Legislative Conference. Please keep your lodging and toll receipts for New Member Orientation, as you must attach them to the travel and expense voucher form that you will complete and submit for your attendance at the orientation session. The appropriate reimbursement form(s) will be provided to you at the orientation session or at the conference.

7. <u>PRE-LEGISLATIVE CONFERENCE MEALS & BANQUET GUESTS</u>

We welcome you to invite your spouse, partner or other guest(s) to attend the educational components of the Pre-Legislative Conference with you. However, we are able to provide complimentary meals during the conference only for legislators. **Returning Legislators and new members-elect will be provided complimentary tickets for Tuesday evening's banquet.** If you would like your guest(s) to accompany you to Tuesday evening's banquet for the incoming legislature that will be held at the Augusta Civic Center, you may purchase tickets for them through the Office of the Executive Director at a cost of \$30 per person. <u>All tickets must be paid for in advance.</u> In addition to returning your conference registration form, include a check made payable to "Treasurer, State of Maine" in the amount of \$30.00 for each guest. Use the <u>RSVP form</u> to make your reservations by Monday, November 28th.

8. <u>LEGISLATIVE POLICY FORUMS</u>

A third component of the orientation program sponsored by the Legislative Council is a regional economic development bus tour that will occur in January and several legislative policy forums on select important policy issues facing the next Legislature. The policy forums will be held in Augusta beginning on Thursday, December 8th with others held in January and February. The bus tour is scheduled for Wednesday, January 18 through Friday, January 20, 2023. During the bus tour, Legislators will have the opportunity to tour various areas of the State to become acquainted with key issues, industries and matters of community interest. No registration for these programs is required at this time.
