RE:	Recommendations on the Governor's Proposed Supplemental Budget, LD 206

On January 25, 2023, the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs reviewed the items in the Governor's proposed supplemental budget pertaining to the agencies under the committee's jurisdiction. Eleven members of the committee were present throughout the work session. Please find attached the supplemental budget report-back document, which indicates the committee's vote on each initiative and language part.

The committee members present voted to approve all initiatives unanimously, except for the following initiatives, which Representative Rudnicki opposed:

- 1. Ref. #8: This initiative adjusts funding to bring allocations in line with projected available resources for fiscal year 2022-23 for the Adult Use Cannabis Public Health and Safety Fund and Municipal Opt-In Fund.
- 2. Ref. #210: This initiative adjusts funding to bring allocations in line with projected available resources for fiscal year 2022-23 for the Gambling Control Board.
- 3. Ref. #223: This initiative provides funding for the increases in election ballot printing, postage and other election costs.
- 4. Ref. # 224: This initiative provides funding for in-state and out-of-state travel to conferences, membership dues and other related costs benefitting the corporations and uniform commercial code program areas.
- 5. Ref. #225: This initiative provides funding for election activities related to petition signature verification and retrieval and return of ballots.

6. Ref. #226: This initiative provides funding for the cost of Electronic Registration Information Center compliance postcards and the increase in the annual membership dues.

Representative Rudnicki also opposed Language Part O, which authorizes the State Controller to carry forward up to \$259,000 of unexpended balance at the end of fiscal years 2022-23 and 2023-24 to the next fiscal year to be used for contracted programming costs to implement online voter registration.

Thank you for your consideration of the recommendations of the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs.

Justification:

This initiative provides funding for the burial of National Guardsmen and Reservists in the Maine Veterans' Cemetery System. In 2022, the Legislature passed Public Law 2021, chapter 593 to enact Maine Revised Statutes, Title 37-B, section 504, subsection 4 which allowed the interment of these service members in the State Veteran Cemeteries. Unfortunately, the National Cemetery Association and Department of Veterans Affairs will not provide a headstone or grave marker for these service members, nor will they provide the State with their standard plot allowance. The plot allowance is used for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Maine Veterans' Cemetery System. Interring National Guardsmen and Reservists in our Maine Veterans' Cemetery System will utilize a considerable amount of land and resources, both of which are limited. Without this funding, families of our interred Guardsmen and Reservists will have to pay for these services. This funding will ensure each interred service member is provided with a headstone or grave marker and ongoing care to the cemetery plot is provided.

Justification:

Supply chain and staffing issues have increased the cost of materials and delivery, which in turn has increased the cost of statewide elections dramatically over the past two years - by about 25%. This request reflects a 25% increase for each election held during the budget period. For fiscal year 2022-23, this includes the 11/2022 Gubernatorial General Election - a \$104,440 increase and the Waldo County Special Election - a \$15,000 increase.

Justification:

Funding for contract worker positions was needed to assist with the verification of petitions in November. There were 159,814 signatures verified on two petitions within 30-day periods. These contracted positions were needed because election staff were not available to complete the work without assistance, due to the election preparations; post-election requirements such as the election tabulation; and Ranked-choice voting (RCV) central count; as well as vacancies and recruitment issues. In addition, funding was needed for memory devices from municipalities and for leased space for the RCV count and election recounts.

Funding will be needed to meet ERIC requirements associated with the printing and mailing of compliance postcards for the purpose of registering eligible, but unregistered voters. The 130th Legislature directed the Secretary of State to join the ERIC program and provided funding to pay the annual maintenance fee for 2021-22 and 2022-23. The ERIC Board voted in 2022 to raise the annual fee for 2022-23 based on increased costs to ERIC.
