Maine's four open Major Disasters aggregate to approximately \$155 million in recovery assistance in a 4 year period. This position is responsible for maintaining documentation across over 300 applicants and multiple disasters, maintaining disaster recovery process schedules, making programmatic and budgetary decisions, and mitigating/managing program issues.
