## Principal reason or purpose for rules:

On June21, 2021, Public Law Chapter 291, "An Act regarding Telehealth Regulations", because law following emergency enactment. The law required licensing boards, including the Board of Licensure in Medicine (BOLIM), Board of Osteopathic Licensure (BOL), and State Board of Nursing (BON), to adopt rules governing telehealth services by their licensees, to include "standards of practice and appropriate restrictions".

### **Basis statement:**

The Board of Licensure in Medicine, the Board of Osteopathic Licensure, and the State Board of Nursing (Boards) were created by the Legislature with the sole purpose of protecting the public. 10 MRS §8008 provides:

**§8008.** Purpose of occupational and professional regulatory boards The sole purpose of an occupational and professional regulatory board is to protect the public health and welfare. A board carries out this purpose by ensuring that the public is served by competent and honest practitioners and by establishing minimum standards of proficiency in the regulated professions by examining, licensing, regulating and disciplining practitioners of those regulated professions. Other goals or objectives may not supersede this purpose.

It is with this purpose in mind that the Boards approach the current rulemaking regarding Chapter 11.
