Per legislative direction, GEO, in coordination with the Department of Marine Resources, is required to establish a Maine Research Consortium by March 2023 with a focus on supporting research to minimize impacts to the Gulf of Maine fishing industry and the environment and reducing the costs of floating offshore wind. The legislature provided initial funding (\$1m/for two years) to establish the Consortium and provide initial research funding. GEO is working with stakeholders to finalize the structure, operations, and membership of the Consortium advisory board. The Bureau manages the statewide Enhanced 9-1-1 (E9-1-1) system serving all Maine's municipalities, plantations, and townships. This initiative creates a federal account in the budget program with the purpose of accounting for grants in the federal expenditures fund as they become available in the future.
