Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'An Act To Allow Civic and Charitable  
Organizations To Serve Wild Game Dinners'**

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:

**'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11217, sub-§2, ¶I** is enacted to read:

I. A civic or charitable organization may serve meat from lawfully killed and registered, if required by this Part, wild game that was donated to that organization as part of a meal at a wild game dinner. For the purposes of this paragraph, "wild game dinner" means a single event where meat from an animal lawfully taken under this Part is cooked and sold to persons at the event for immediate consumption.'

**SUMMARY**

This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, removes the provisions of the bill that allow a person to sell the meat of a lawfully killed wild animal at a wild game dinner or to the organizer of a wild game dinner, instead providing that a civic or charitable organization may serve at a wild game dinner meat from lawfully killed wild game that was donated to that organization.
