1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1533, sub-§2, ¶D-1 is enacted to read:
3 4	D-1. Explore options for entering into contracts with other states to test samples collected during screening for lysosomal storage disorders;
5	Sec. 2. Department of Health and Human Services to amend rules on the
6	newborn screening program. By January 1, 2018, the Department of Health and
7	Human Services shall amend its rules in Chapter 283 relating to testing newborn infants
8	for detection of causes of cognitive disabilities and selected genetic conditions to include
9	screening for the lysosomal storage disorders known as Krabbe, Pompe, Gaucher, Fabry
10	and Niemann-Pick diseases.
11	SUMMARY
12	This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its rules in
13	Chapter 283 relating to the newborn screening program by January 1, 2018 to add to the
14	program the lysosomal storage disorders known as Krabbe, Pompe, Gaucher, Fabry and
15	Niemann-Pick diseases. It directs the department to explore options to enter into
16	contracts with other states to test samples collected for lysosomal storage disorders.
