**Resolve, To Require the Department of Education To Form a Family Income Data Collection Working Group**

- 1 Sec. 1. Family income data collection working group. Resolved: That the 2 Department of Education shall form a working group to explore and recommend changes 3 to how schools collect family income data. The membership of the working group consists 4 of:
  - 1. One or more representatives of the Department of Education;

- 2. One representative from the Department of Health and Human Services;
- 3. One representative from the Maine Education Policy Research Institute;

8 4. One representative from the University of Southern Maine's Food Studies Program;9 and

5. One representative from the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry's
stakeholder group assembled pursuant to Resolve 2019, chapter 32 to end hunger in Maine
by 2030.

In addition, the Department of Education shall invite the participation of a
representative from the Maine School Nutrition Association, the Maine School
Management Association, a nonprofit association addressing child hunger in the State, a
nonprofit organization addressing overall child welfare in the State and the United States
Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service, Northeast Regional Office.

18 Sec. 2. Duties. Resolved: That the working group under section 1 shall evaluate 19 the methods by which schools collect family income data, including family income data 20 that is collected by schools to secure funding for school nutrition programs but is also used 21 for other programs. The working group shall explore and recommend means of collecting 22 family income data other than through school nutrition programs.

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That, by January 4, 2022, the Department of Education
shall submit a report, including suggested legislation, on the working group's evaluation in
section 2 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. The
committee is authorized to submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular
Session of the 130th Legislature.

SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Department of Education to form a working group to explore and recommend changes to how schools collect family income data, including family income data that is collected by schools to secure funding for school nutrition programs but is also used for other programs. The department is directed to submit a report by January 4, 2022 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs, which is authorized to submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.
