1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1107-A, sub-§6** is enacted to read:

3 **6. It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that:**

4 A. The evidence of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking, in  
5 good faith, medical assistance for someone experiencing a drug-related overdose; or

6 B. The evidence of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking or  
7 obtaining medical assistance for a drug-related overdose the person is experiencing.

8 The assertion of an affirmative defense under this subsection is not grounds for  
9 suppression of evidence with respect to any crime.

10 **SUMMARY**

11 This bill creates an affirmative defense to prosecution for unlawful possession of a  
12 scheduled drug. The bill specifies that it is an affirmative defense to prosecution that the  
13 evidence of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking, in good faith,  
14 medical assistance for someone experiencing a drug-related overdose or the evidence of  
15 possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking or obtaining medical  
16 assistance for a drug-related overdose the person is experiencing. The bill also specifies  
17 that the affirmative defense is not grounds for suppression of evidence with respect to any  
18 crime.
