1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §5805, sub-§6** is enacted to read:

3 **6. Per-pupil funding.** Notwithstanding subsections 1 and 2, beginning with the
4 2014-2015 school year, a sending school administrative unit shall include in tuition paid
5 to a receiving school administrative unit the amounts attributable to the per-pupil amounts
6 received by the sending unit for cocurricular and extracurricular activities under section
7 15680, subsection 1, paragraph D, as targeted funds to implement a standards-based
8 system under section 15681, subsection 2-A and as targeted technology resource funds
9 under section 15681, subsection 3.

10 **Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §5806, sub-§4** is enacted to read:

11 **4. Per-pupil funding.** Notwithstanding subsections 1 and 3, beginning with the
12 2014-2015 school year, a sending school administrative unit shall include in tuition paid
13 to a receiving private school the amounts attributable to the per-pupil amounts received
14 by the sending unit for cocurricular and extracurricular activities under section 15680,
15 subsection 1, paragraph D, as targeted funds to implement a standards-based system
16 under section 15681, subsection 2-A and as targeted technology resource funds under
17 section 15681, subsection 3.

18 **SUMMARY**

19 This bill provides that a school administrative unit sending a secondary school
20 student to another public school or a private school must pay to the receiving school, in
21 addition to tuition, per-pupil amounts for cocurricular and extracurricular activities and
22 targeted funds for implementation of a standards-based system and technology resources.
