To Proceed through Red Lights and Make Right Turns on Red in
Contravention of Posted Prohibitions**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2057, sub-§1, ¶C**, as repealed and replaced by PL 2003, c.
3 452, Pt. Q, §36 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is amended to read:

4 C. **A** Except as provided by paragraph C-3, a red light, if steady and circular, means:

5 (1) The operator must stop and remain stationary until an indication to proceed is
6 shown; or

7 (2) The operator may cautiously enter the intersection to make a right turn after
8 stopping if:

9 (a) Not prohibited by an appropriate sign such as "NO RIGHT TURN ON
10 RED"; and

11 (b) The operator executing a turn yields the right-of-way to pedestrians on a
12 crosswalk and to a vehicle having a green signal at the intersection.

13 **Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §2057, sub-§1, ¶C-3** is enacted to read:

14 C-3. Notwithstanding paragraph C, the operator of a motorcycle, moped or bicycle
15 as defined in section 2063, subsection 1 facing a red light, if steady and circular, after
16 stopping for a reasonable amount of time may proceed cautiously through the
17 intersection before the light on the traffic-control device turns green if no other
18 vehicles are present at the intersection to actuate the traffic-control device. The
19 operator of a motorcycle, moped or bicycle proceeding through a red light under this
20 paragraph shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicular traffic proceeding through a
21 green light at the intersection or a pedestrian lawfully within a crosswalk or using the
22 intersection.

23 **SUMMARY**

24 This bill allows the operator of a motorcycle, moped or bicycle, including a
25 motorized bicycle, motorized tricycle or motorized scooter, facing a steady and circular
26 red light, after stopping for a reasonable amount of time, to proceed cautiously through
27 the intersection before the light on the traffic-control device turns green if no other
28 vehicles are present at the intersection to actuate the traffic-control device.
