1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §409, sub-§5**, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and
3 affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

4 **5. Other taxes.** A motor vehicle, mobile home, camp trailer or truck camper may
5 not be registered until the excise tax or personal property tax or real estate tax has been
6 paid in accordance with Title 36, sections 551, 602, 1482 and 1484. The Secretary of
7 State may provide municipal excise tax collectors with a standard vehicle registration
8 form for the collection of excise tax.

32 of trees to be harvested for commercial use. Those schedules may be required at such

39 for recreational or educational use;
- 40 E. The importance of the land in preserving a local or regional landscape or resource
41 that attracts tourism or commerce to the area;

- 1 F. The likelihood that the preservation of the land as undeveloped open space will
2 provide economic benefit to the town by limiting municipal expenditures required to
3 service development;
- 4 G. Whether the land is included in an area designated as open space land or resource
5 protection land on a comprehensive plan or in a zoning ordinance or on a zoning map
6 as finally adopted;
- 7 H. The existence of a conservation easement, other legally enforceable restriction, or
8 ownership by a nonprofit entity committed to conservation of the property that will
9 permanently preserve the land in its natural, scenic or open character;
- 10 I. The proximity of other private or public conservation lands protected by
11 permanent easement or ownership by governmental or nonprofit entities committed
12 to conservation of the property;
- 13 J. The likelihood that protection of the land will contribute to the ecological viability
14 of a local, state or national park, nature preserve, wildlife refuge, wilderness area or
15 similar protected area;

20 taxation under this subchapter, to the assessor upon a form to be prescribed by the State
21 Tax Assessor that must contain a description of the parcel, together with a map
22 identifying the location and boundaries of the working waterfront land, a description of
23 the manner in which the land is used primarily for commercial fishing activities and other
24 information the assessor may require to aid the assessor in the determination of

36 as applicable, or the minimum lot size provided by the zoning ordinance or zoning map
37 pertaining to the area in which the remaining portion is located.

40 **1. Annual excise tax.** An annual excise tax ~~shall be levied annually~~ is imposed with
41 respect to each ~~calendar~~ registration year in the following cases:

42 A. For the privilege of operating an aircraft within the State, each heavier-than-air
43 aircraft or lighter-than-air aircraft operated in this State that is owned or controlled by

1 a resident of this State is subject to an excise tax computed as follows: 9 mills on
2 each dollar of the maker's average equipped price for the first or current year of
3 model; 7 mills for the 2nd year; 5 mills for the 3rd year; 4 mills for the 4th year; and
4 3 mills for the 5th and succeeding years. The minimum tax is \$10. Nonresidents of
5 this State who operate aircraft within this State for compensation or hire and are
6 required to register under Title 6 must pay 1/12 of the tax amount computed as

12 model, 20 mills for the 2nd year, 16 mills for the 3rd year and 12 mills for the 4th
13 year and succeeding years. The minimum tax ~~shall be~~ is \$15.

14 C. For the privilege of operating a motor vehicle or camper trailer on the public
15 ways, each motor vehicle, other than a stock race car, or each camper trailer to be so
16 operated is subject to excise tax as follows, except as specified in subparagraph (3): a
17 sum equal to 24 mills on each dollar of the maker's list price for the first or current
18 year of model, 17 1/2 mills for the 2nd year, 13 1/2 mills for the 3rd year, 10 mills for
19 the 4th year, 6 1/2 mills for the 5th year and 4 mills for the 6th and succeeding years.
20 The minimum tax is \$5 for a motor vehicle other than a bicycle with motor attached,
21 \$2.50 for a bicycle with motor attached, \$15 for a camper trailer other than a tent
22 trailer and \$5 for a tent trailer. The excise tax on a stock race car is \$5.

23 (1) On new registrations of automobiles, trucks and truck tractors, the excise tax
24 payment must be made prior to registration and is for a one-year period from the
25 date of registration.

26 (2) Vehicles registered under the International Registration Plan are subject to an
27 excise tax determined on a monthly proration basis if their registration period is
28 less than 12 months.

29 (3) For commercial vehicles manufactured in model year 1996 and after, the
30 amount of excise tax due for trucks or truck tractors registered for more than
31 26,000 pounds and for Class A special mobile equipment, as defined in Title
32 29-A, section 101, subsection 70, is based on the purchase price in the original
33 year of title rather than on the list price. Verification of purchase price for the
34 application of excise tax is determined by the initial bill of sale or the state sales
35 tax document provided at point of purchase. The initial bill of sale is that issued
36 by the dealer to the initial purchaser of a new vehicle.

37 For motor vehicles being registered pursuant to Title 29-A, section 405, subsection 1,
38 paragraph C, the excise tax must be prorated for the number of months in the
39 registration.
