Maine Regarding the Election of Senators**

1 **Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the
2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be
3 proposed:

4 **Constitution, Art. II, §4** is amended to read:

5 **Section 4. Time of state election; absentee voting.** The election of Senators
6 and Representatives shall be on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November
7 biennially ~~forever and the election of~~, except as provided in this section. Beginning with
8 the general election held in 2022, the election of Senators and the Governor shall be on
9 the Tuesday following the first Monday of November every 4 years. The Legislature
10 under proper enactment shall authorize and provide for voting by citizens of the State
11 absent therefrom in the Armed Forces of the United States or of this State and for voting
12 by other citizens absent or physically incapacitated for reasons deemed sufficient.

13 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Second, §1** is amended to read:

14 **Section 1. Number of Senators.** The Senate shall consist of an odd number of
15 Senators, not less than 31 nor more than 35, except that, on or after December 7, 2022,
16 the Senate shall consist of 32 Senators, elected at the same time and for the same term as
17 Representatives by the qualified electors of the districts into which the State shall be from
18 time to time divided except that beginning with the general election held in 2022,
19 Senators are elected as provided in Article II, Section 4.

20 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Second, §2, first ¶** is amended to read:

21 **Section 2. Submission of reapportionment plan to Secretary of Senate;**
22 **Legislature's action on commission's plan; division of State into Senatorial**
23 **Districts; division by Supreme Judicial Court.** The Legislature which shall
24 convene in the year 2013, ~~and also the Legislature which shall convene in the year 2021~~
25 ~~and every tenth year thereafter,~~ shall cause the State to be divided into districts for the
26 choice of a Senator from each district, using the same method as provided in Article IV,
27 Part First, Section 2 for apportionment of Representative Districts, and the Legislature
28 which shall convene on January 5, 2022 shall reapportion the State so that the Senatorial
29 Districts coincide with the counties of the State, resulting in the voters of each county
30 having the right to vote for 2 Senators.

31 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Second, §5** is amended to read:

32 **Section 5. Determination of Senators elected; procedure for filling**
33 **vacancies.** The Senate shall, on said first Wednesday of December, biennially until the
34 general election held in 2022 and quadrennially thereafter determine who is elected by a
35 plurality of votes to be Senator in each district. All vacancies in the Senate arising from
36 death, resignation, removal from the State or like causes, and also vacancies, if any,
37 which may occur because of the failure of any district to elect by a plurality of votes the
38 Senator to which said district shall be entitled shall be filled by an immediate election in
39 the unrepresented district. The Governor shall issue a proclamation therefor and therein
40 fix the time of such election.

- 1 Senators per county. The resolution also requires the redrawing of district lines in 2022.
- 2 The resolution increases the Senate term from 2 to 4 years.
