2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §2, sub-§12-A,</b> as amended by PL 2009, c. 652, Pt. A, §41, is further amended to read:
4 5 6 7	<b>12-A. Hard cider.</b> "Hard cider" means liquor produced by fermentation of the juice of apples <u>or pears</u> , including, but not limited to, flavored, sparkling or carbonated cider, that contains not less than 1/2 of 1% alcohol by volume and not more than <del>7%</del> 8.5% alcohol by volume.
8	Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 2017.
9	SUMMARY
10	This bill amends the definition of "hard cider" to be consistent with the definition of
11	"hard cider" in federal law as administered by the United States Department of the
12	Treasury, Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau. Like the federal definition, the
13	change to the definition of "hard cider" in this bill takes effect on January 1, 2017. The
14	bill increases the allowable alcohol content from 7% to 8.5% and allows hard cider to be
15	produced from the juice of pears as well as of apples.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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
