1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2396, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
3 4 5	5. Solid precipitation. A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a public way with a load of solid precipitation on the motor vehicle. For the purposes of this subsection, "solid precipitation" includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice, hail and sleet.
6 7 8	When a reasonable effort has been made to completely remove a load of solid precipitation from a motor vehicle, minor amounts blown from the motor vehicle while in transit do not evidence a violation of this subsection.
9 10 11	Notwithstanding subsection 2, a violation of this subsection is a traffic infraction subject to a fine of not less than \$250 for the first offense and not less than \$500 for a 2nd or subsequent offense.
12	Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §2396, sub-§6 is enacted to read:
13	6. Exemption. Subsection 5 does not apply to commercial motor vehicles.
14	This subsection is repealed May 1, 2026.
15	SUMMARY
16 17 18 19 20	This bill prohibits a person from operating a motor vehicle on a public way without clearing the motor vehicle of solid precipitation. Operating a motor vehicle under such circumstances is a traffic infraction subject to a \$250 fine for a first offense and \$500 for a 2nd or subsequent offense. The prohibition does not apply to commercial vehicles until May 1, 2026.
