1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-G, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 731, Pt. OO, §1, is amended to read:
4 5 6	A. A qualified woman during her pregnancy and up to 60 days 12 months following delivery when the woman's family income is equal to or below 200% of the nonfarm income official poverty line;
7 8	Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3174-G, sub-§1, \P G, as amended by IB 2017, c. 1, Pt. A, §2, is further amended to read:
9 10	G. A person who is a noncitizen legally admitted to the United States to the extent that coverage is allowable by federal law if the person is:
11 12	(1) A woman during her pregnancy and up to 60 days 12 months following delivery; or
13	(2) A child under 21 years of age; and
14	SUMMARY
15 16	This bill extends from 60 days to 12 months the period of time following delivery of a baby that a woman may be eligible for services under MaineCare.
