An Act to Prevent Student Homelessness

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:			
Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA c. 223, sub-c. 12 is enacted to read:			
SUBCHAPTER 12			
STUDENT HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION			
1. Student Homelessness Prevention Program			
The Student Homelessness Prevention Program, referred to in this section as "the ram," is established within the department in the office of the department responsible school and student supports.			
. Purpose. The purpose of the program is to help elementary students and secondary nts avoid homelessness by identifying students and families of students who are at of homelessness and providing direct financial assistance to help them maintain stable anent housing.			
. Fund established. The Student Homelessness Prevention Fund is established as a apsing fund within the department for the purposes of supporting the program. The may receive money from any available state, federal or private source.			
. Program requirements. The department shall provide a local educational agency on for students experiencing homelessness designated pursuant to the federal inney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Improvements Act of 2001, 42 United s Code, Section 11431 et seq. The liaison shall:			
A. Identify students who are at risk of homelessness but not yet homeless; and			
B. In addition to any federal assistance available, provide up to \$750 per academic year to the family or guardian of a student at risk of homelessness for services authorized ander the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Improvements Act of 2001, in addition to other housing-related needs such as rental assistance, utilities, ritical home repairs and other assistance that will help the student avoid homelessness.			
Assistance not income or asset. Financial assistance received under the program tincome for purposes of the State's income tax laws and is not income or an asset for urposes of determining eligibility for or the benefit amount to be paid from any public tance program administered by the State or by a municipality pursuant to Title 22, ter 1161.			
Rules. The department may adopt rules to implement the program. Rules adopted and to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, hapter 2-A.			
Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and ations are made.

1 Initiative: Provides ongoing funds to help students avoid homelessness by providing 2 liaisons designated pursuant to the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Education 3 Assistance Improvements Act of 2001 access to emergency financial assistance for the 4 family of a student in an amount of up to \$750 per student.
