1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-PPP is enacted to read:
3	§3174-PPP. Reimbursement for doula services
4 5 6 7 8	1. Definition. For purposes of this section, "doula services" means the provision of services by a nonclinical professional related to the physical, emotional and informational support of pregnant persons before, during and after childbirth, including, but not limited to, guidance and support around pregnancy health, childbirth, breastfeeding and newborn care.
9 10 11 12	2. Reimbursement. Beginning January 1, 2026, the department shall provide reimbursement under the MaineCare program for doula services, including, but not limited to, a maximum of 4 prenatal and 4 postnatal visits with a nonclinical professional providing doula services.
13 14 15	3. Rulemaking. The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined by Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
16	SUMMARY
17	This bill requires reimbursement under the MaineCare program for doula services.
