An Act to Protect the Public Health by Allowing the Appointment of Associate Health Officers

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §411, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:
3 4 5	1-A. Associate health officer. "Associate health officer" means a municipal employee who has knowledge of the community and meets the educational, training and experience standards established by the local health officer.
6	Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §451, sub-§7 is enacted to read:
7 8 9 10 11 12 13	7. Associate health officers. Municipal officers may appoint one or more associated health officers, as defined in section 411, subsection 1-A, to assist the local health officer perform the local health officer's duties during an actual or threatened epidemic or other public health threat. An associate health officer is not required to meet the qualifications set out in subsection 2 or in rules applicable to local health officers adopted by the department. An associate health officer must work under the direct supervision of the local health officer.

24 25 26 27 28	This bill permits a municipality to hire associate health officers, as defined, to assist the local health officer during an actual or threatened epidemic or other public health threat. An associate health officer must have appropriate education, training or experience, is not required to meet the qualifications of a local health officer and must work under the direct supervision of the local health officer.
