1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3 **Whereas,** this resolve establishes the Commission To Study the Creation of a State
4 and Federal Fish and Wildlife Museum at the Massabesic Experimental Forest in Alfred
5 and Lyman; and

6 **Whereas,** the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that
7 the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next
8 legislative session; and

9 **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
12 therefore, be it

13 **Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved:** That the Commission To Study
14 the Creation of a State and Federal Fish and Wildlife Museum at the Massabesic
15 Experimental Forest in Alfred and Lyman, referred to in this resolve as "the commission,"
16 is established; and be it further

17 **Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved:** That the commission consists of
18 the following 13 members:

19 1. Three members of the Senate who are members of the Joint Standing Committee
20 on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, appointed by the President of the Senate;

21 2. Four members of the House of Representatives who are members of the Joint
22 Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, appointed by the Speaker of the
23 House;

24 3. Three members appointed by the Governor as follows:

25 A. A member who is a representative of an organization that represents sportsmen of
26 the State;

27 B. A member who represents the trappers of the State; and

28 C. A member of the public who has an interest in preserving, protecting and
29 enhancing the inland fisheries and wildlife resources of the State;

30 4. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, or the
31 commissioner's designee;

32 5. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, or the commissioner's
33 designee; and

34 6. The Director of the Division of Forestry within the Department of Agriculture,
35 Conservation and Forestry, or the director's designee; and be it further
