An Act To Amend the Laws Governing Pilotage Requirements for Passenger Ferry Service between Maine and Nova Scotia

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §87-A, sub-§1, ¶D-1** is enacted to read:

3 D-1. A vessel on regularly scheduled ferry operations between Bar Harbor, Maine
4 and Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, as long as the master of that vessel has completed an
5 appropriate number of trips as established by commission rules and has met any
6 appropriate federal requirements;

7 **Sec. 2. P&SL 1981, c. 98, §5, sub-§2, 2nd ¶**, as amended by PL 2011, c. 498,
8 §2, is further amended to read:

9 This section does not apply to vessels under enrollment, fishing vessels or vessels
10 powered by sail. This section does not apply to United States flagged vessels primarily
11 engaged in the carriage of passengers for hire that operate on a published annual schedule
12 and that are not in excess of 500 feet in overall length and have a draft not in excess of 20
13 feet, as long as the master of any such vessel has navigated that specific vessel on the
14 waters described in this section with the assistance of a pilot for a minimum of 15 round
15 trips of ingress and egress to the waters described in this section. This section does not
16 apply to foreign flagged vessels primarily engaged in the carriage of passengers for hire
17 that operate on a published annual schedule and that are not in excess of 500 feet in
18 overall length and have a draft not in excess of 20 feet, as long as the master of any such
19 vessel has navigated that specific vessel on the waters described in this section with the
20 assistance of a pilot for a minimum number of round trips of ingress and egress to the
21 waters described under this section as established by the Board of Harbor Commissioners
22 through rulemaking. A pilot must pilot a vessel as described in this paragraph upon the
23 waters described in this section at least one round trip during each calendar month that
24 the vessel operates upon the waters described in this section and at such other times as
25 may be required by the Board of Harbor Commissioners to ensure port safety after
26 hearing and notice.

27 **SUMMARY**

28 This bill amends the pilotage requirements for vessels providing regularly scheduled
29 passenger ferry service between Bar Harbor, Maine and Yarmouth, Nova Scotia.
