Resolve, to Establish a Task Force to Create a Court Navigation Program Plan

(EMERGENCY)

- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
  - Whereas, this legislation needs to take effect before the expiration of the 90-day period due to the rise in the number of litigants who are not represented by an attorney and in order to provide the task force established by this resolve sufficient time to complete its work; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
  the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
  immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
  therefore, be it
- 11 Sec. 1. University of Maine System to convene task force. Resolved: That 12 the University of Maine System shall convene a task force, referred to in this resolve as 13 "the task force," to create a court navigation program plan. The membership of the task 14 force must consist of a representative from each of the following:
- 15 1. The schools of social work of the University of Maine System;
- 16 2. The University of Maine School of Law;
- 17 3. Maine Pretrial Services, Inc.;
- 18 4. Pine Tree Legal Assistance;
- 19 5. Disability Rights Maine;
- 20 6. The National Alliance on Mental Illness Maine;
- 21 7. 211 Maine; and

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- 22 8. The Department of Health and Human Services.
- The University of Maine System shall invite the participation of representatives of the
   judicial branch, including representatives of the appropriate specialty courts.

25 Sec. 2. Court navigation program plan. Resolved: That the task force shall create a court navigation program plan. In developing the plan, the task force shall examine 26 27 court navigation programs nationwide and recommend a model for a court navigation 28 program for use in this State. The court navigation program must provide guidance and 29 information about court processes and procedures to persons involved with the court 30 system. The court navigation program also must refer persons involved with the court 31 system to community-based resources related to their behavioral health needs, such as 32 mental health treatment and substance use disorder treatment, and their economic and 33 social service-related needs, such as housing, employment, transportation and food, in order to address those needs. The task force shall consider experiential learning 34 35 opportunities for social work students and law students who assist in the court navigation program to earn academic credit. 36

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 3, 2025, the task force
shall submit a report that includes the court navigation program plan required by section 2,
including a model for a court navigation program for use in this State, and that includes
suggested legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. The joint standing

committee may report out legislation based on the subject matter of the report to the Second
 Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

- Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation
   takes effect when approved.
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## **SUMMARY**

6 This resolve directs the University of Maine System to convene a task force to create 7 a court navigation program plan. In developing the plan, the task force must examine court 8 navigation programs nationwide and recommend a model for a court navigation program 9 for use in this State. The court navigation program must provide guidance and information 10 about court processes and procedures to persons involved with the court system. The court 11 navigation program also must refer persons involved with the court system to communitybased resources related to their behavioral health needs, such as mental health treatment 12 and substance use disorder treatment, and their economic and social service-related needs. 13 14 such as housing, employment, transportation and food, in order to address those needs. The 15 task force must consider experiential learning opportunities for social work students and 16 law students who assist in the court navigation program to earn academic credit. No later than December 3, 2025, the task force must submit a report that includes the court 17 18 navigation program plan, including a model for a court navigation program for use in this 19 State, and that includes suggested legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. 20 The joint standing committee may report out legislation based on the subject matter of the 21 report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.
