A person who has been assigned a designated hunting area, zone or season by the department for purposes of hunting a game animal may exchange that designated zone, area or season with another person assigned a different hunting zone, area or season for the same game animal for purposes of hunting that same game animal. The department may assist in the exchange to ensure that the permit holders meet the requirements of section 10756, but the State bears no responsibility for enforcing the terms of the exchange between the permit holders. The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
27	2. Transfer of moose permit for consideration prohibited. Notwithstanding
28 29	subsection 1, the holder of a moose permit who has been assigned a designated hunting area, zone or season by the department may not exchange that designated zone, area or
30	season with another person assigned a different hunting zone, area or season for any
31 32	consideration other than the other person's different hunting zone, area or season. A person who violates this subsection commits a Class D crime.
33 34	3. Facilitating transfer of a moose permit prohibited. A person may not facilitate the exchange of moose permits between holders of moose permits who are exchanging

those permits pursuant to subsection 1. A person who violates this subsection commits a
Class E crime.'

3 SUMMARY

 This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, replaces the bill. The bill repeals the prohibition on exchanging a moose permit for consideration and directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to establish an online transfer system for permits. The amendment removes the provision of the bill that directs the department to establish an online transfer system for permits, but, like the bill, the amendment repeals the prohibition on exchanging moose permits for consideration. This amendment prohibits persons other than the holders of moose permits who are exchanging hunting zones, areas or seasons to facilitate the exchange. The amendment establishes that a person who facilitates an exchange of moose permits commits a Class E crime. The amendment clarifies that the State bears no responsibility for enforcing the terms of an exchange between the permit holders.
