'Sec. WW-2. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Emergency Housing Relief Fund. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall transfer \$2,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine State Housing Authority, Emergency Housing Relief Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account to provide rental assistance, supplement or create other programs addressing the needs of people experiencing homelessness or facing other immediate housing needs, supplement other short-term rental assistance programs, create supportive housing for people with disabilities, mental health challenges or substance use disorder using an approach that prioritizes providing permanent housing to people experiencing homelessness and support other uses that address housing emergencies in the State.'

Amend the amendment in Part XX by striking out all of section 7 and inserting the following:

'Sec. XX-7. Transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall transfer \$15,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program, Fund To

3 Amend the amendment by inserting after Part JJJ the following:

4 **PART KKK**

5 **Sec. KKK-1. Motor vehicle fuel tax suspended.** Notwithstanding any provision
 6 of law to the contrary, beginning May 1, 2022 and until December 31, 2022, the State may
 7 not impose an excise tax on gasoline or diesel motor vehicle fuel pursuant to the Maine
 8 Revised Statutes, Title 36, sections 2903 and 3203.

9 **Sec. KKK-2. Transfer from unappropriated surplus of General Fund to**
 10 **unallocated surplus of Highway Fund.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
 11 contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$37,450,000 from
 12 the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the unallocated surplus of the Highway
 13 Fund and, on or before June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall transfer \$115,200,000 from
 14 the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the unallocated surplus of the Highway
 15 Fund.

30 **SUMMARY**

31 This amendment provides an 8-month suspension of the imposition of an excise tax on
 32 gasoline and diesel motor vehicle fuel pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36,
 33 sections 2903 and 3203. It also does the following.

34 1. It removes the provisions that change the credit for educational opportunity and
 35 enact the student loan repayment tax credit.

36 2. It removes the provision requiring the transfer of \$3,000,000 to assist agricultural
 37 producers in the State that have been affected by PFAS contamination, to provide support
 38 to affected farms, to support critical PFAS research and to otherwise allow for the
 39 department to strategically and effectively respond to PFAS concerns and issues.

40 3. It removes the provision that requires the transfer of \$3,500,000 to support electric
 41 vehicle rebate programs, including incentive programs.

1 4. It removes the provisions that reestablish the Commission To Develop a Paid Family
2 and Medical Leave Benefits Program and that fund an actuarial study.

3 5. It removes the provisions that establish and fund the Imagination Library of Maine
4 Fund.

5 6. It removes the provision requiring the transfer of \$20,000,000 to the Maine
6 Community College System Free Community College - 2 Enrollment Years program.

7 7. It decreases from \$22,000,000 to \$2,000,000 the amount required to be transferred
8 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine State Housing Authority,
9 Emergency Housing Relief Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account to be used to
10 provide rental assistance, supplement or create other programs addressing the needs of
11 people experiencing homelessness or facing other immediate housing needs, supplement
12 other short-term rental assistance programs, create supportive housing for people with
13 disabilities, mental health challenges or substance use disorder using an approach that
14 prioritizes providing permanent housing to people experiencing homelessness and support
15 other uses to address housing emergencies in the State.

16 8. It decreases from \$55,000,000 to \$15,000,000 the amount required to be transferred
17 on or before June 30, 2023 to the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination within the
18 Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. It does not change the amount,
19 \$5,000,000, required to be transferred on or before May 1, 2022.

20 9. It removes funding for temporary positions in the Bureau of Revenue Services;
21 removes funding for competitive grants to regional service providers and community
22 housing implementation grants in the Housing Opportunity Program; removes funding for
23 operation costs in the Governor's Office; removes funding for positions in the Office of
24 Policy Innovation and the Future; and removes funding for positions in the courts.

25 10. It transfers funds from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the
26 unallocated surplus of the Highway Fund to offset the reduction in Highway Fund revenue.
