21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31	This amendment changes the 3-day snowmobile registration fee for nonresidents from \$69 to \$74 and the 10-day snowmobile registration fee for nonresidents from \$95 to \$99. The portion of the registration fees allocated to help fund the Snowmobile Trail Fund and the fund responsible for capital equipment grants are changed. Ten dollars from resident registration fees and \$15 from nonresident registration fees must be transferred to the fund used for capital equipment grants. The portion of the nonresident registration fees allocated to the Snowmobile Trail Fund are reduced by \$5. This amendment also designates that \$5 from the 3-day and 10-day nonresident registration fees must be transferred to the Snowmobile Enforcement Fund established in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, Bureau of Warden Service. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
