For the purposes of this subsection, "camping device" means a tent, registered tent trailer, registered pickup camper, registered recreational vehicle, registered trailer or similar device lawfully used for camping.'

The amendment provides that the Maine Land Use Planning Commission may not limit the number of days a person may store an unoccupied camping device at a lawfully existing camping location within a campground permitted by the commission or a campground that lawfully existed at the time of district regulation and does not currently conform to district regulations.
