40 41	This amendment adds language clarifying the authority of the Department of Health and Human Services to report cancer-incidence registry data and vital statistics data to the		

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1 Maine Health Data Organization. The amendment provides authorization for the Maine 2 Health Data Organization and the Department of Health and Human Services to jointly 3 adopt a rule with respect to reporting this data to the Maine Health Data Organization and 4 designates the data as confidential. The data may be released to the public only in 5 accordance with the Maine Health Data Organization's rule governing release of data to the 6 public.

7 The amendment also makes technical changes to clarify the terms and compensation 8 of Legislators serving on the advisory committee established in the bill and adds an 9 appropriations and allocations section for the costs of Legislator participation.
