For purposes of this section, "waste" means to intentionally leave a wounded or killed animal in the field or forest without making a reasonable effort to retrieve and render it for consumption or use. This subsection does not apply to coyote.
22 23 24 25	Sec. 2. Data collection. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall develop a process to improve year-round data collection and coyote management procedures, taking into consideration the use of electronic tagging and surveys of coyote hunters and landowners.
26 27 28 29	Sec. 3. Report. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters no later than January 15, 2025 any data collected on coyote harvest and survey results.'

33 34	This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment removes the exception for coyote from the law governing waste of game. The amendment also directs

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the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to develop a process to improve year-1 round data collection and coyote management procedures, taking into consideration the use 2 of electronic tagging and surveys of coyote hunters and landowners.
