A living kidney donor may be awarded a grant under this section of not more than \$5,000. For purposes of this section, "living kidney donor" means an individual who is not deceased from whom a kidney is removed for transplant to another individual.

Administration of the program includes determining eligibility for the grants and disbursing grants directly to living kidney donors. The department may disburse funds appropriated or allocated to the program to the entity with which it has contracted to administer the program. The department shall contract with the entity for administration of the living kidney donor grant program under this section as long as funding is available. As a condition of disbursing funds to the entity with which it has contracted to administer the program, the department may require that entity to provide to the department a report about the activities and services provided by the program.
