12 13	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:
14	'Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1107-A, sub-§6 is enacted to read:
15	6. It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that:
16 17	A. The evidence of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking, in good faith, medical assistance for someone experiencing a drug-related overdose; or
18 19	B. The evidence of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking of obtaining medical assistance for a drug-related overdose the person is experiencing.
20 21	The assertion of an affirmative defense under this subsection is not grounds for suppression of evidence with respect to any crime.'
22	SUMMARY
23	This amendment replaces the bill and creates an affirmative defense to prosecution
24	The amendment specifies that it is an affirmative defense to prosecution that the evidence
25	of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking, in good faith, medical
26 27	assistance for someone experiencing a drug-related overdose or the evidence of possession was obtained as a result of the person's seeking or obtaining medical
28	assistance for a drug-related overdose the person is experiencing. The amendment also
29	specifies that the affirmative defense is not grounds for suppression of evidence with
30	respect to any crime.
