The 8 9 amendment removes the limitation proposed in the bill that impact fees must be related to 10 infrastructure improvements on land or property that directly abuts the development. The amendment repeals the provisions of law that established the Housing Opportunity 11 12 Program within the Department of Economic and Community Development and

includes an appropriations and allocations section to accomplish this transfer.
