An educational technician certificate issued under this subsection is for the same period and subject to the same renewal standards as specified in subsection 3. State board rules may further govern qualifications for an educational technician certificate issued under this subsection.'

The amendment provides that, beginning August 1, 2026, a full-time teacher in a public charter school must hold an appropriate teaching certificate. The amendment also provides that, beginning August 1, 2026, the Commissioner of Education may reissue an educational technician certificate to a person who has been receiving a retirement benefit from the State Employee and Teacher Retirement Program for no more than 3 years and whose lapsed certificate had been in good standing.
