The Let's Grow Maine Program is est procure fruits and vegetables from farm businesses in the State for distribution and low-income families with children, through a public and private partnershing to provide hunger relief. The primary function of the program is the purchase and vegetables grown in the State at a volume that meets the emergency food needs in the State, subject to the need to develop effective storage and deliver for this food.	to schools ip, in order se of fruits assistance

Food Security Council.** The Food Security Council, established in Title 5, 2 section 12004-I, subsection 6-I, is an advisory council that is responsible for determining 3 regional emergency food assistance needs and developing a comprehensive strategy to 4 focus allocation of resources under the program. The council is composed of the 5 following members: 6 A. Nine voting members representing each of the 9 public health districts described 7 in Title 22, section 411, appointed by the Governor; and 8 B. Four nonvoting members, as follows: 9 (1) The director of the State's emergency food assistance program, or the 10 commissioner's designee; 11 (2) A representative of the Department of Health and Human Services, Maine 12 Center for Disease Control and Prevention appointed by the Commissioner of Health and Human Services; and 13 14 (3) Two private sector professionals with expertise in the State's emergency food network, one appointed by the President of the Senate and one appointed by the 15 16 Speaker of the House, each appointed to a 2-year term. 17 4. Legislative oversight. The committee has legislative oversight of the council. 18 The council shall submit recommendations to the department no later than February 1st 19 of each year. If the council does not submit recommendations to the department, the 20 committee shall develop and report the committee's own recommendations to the department by April 1st of each year. The department shall submit a report annually, by 21 22 January 15th, to the committee, providing an update on the status of the program and 23 expenditures from the fund. 24 5. Food and Farm Fund. The Food and Farm Fund is established as a special fund 25 in the State Treasury. The department shall administer the fund exclusively for the purpose of administering the program established by this section, including the costs of 26 27 fund administration. All money in the fund must be deposited, administered and 28 disbursed in the same manner and under the same conditions and requirements as are 29 provided by law for other special funds. Any unencumbered balance in the fund 30 remaining at the end of any fiscal year does not lapse but must be carried forward for 31 continued use in the program. 32 Funds may be used for the purchase of fruits and vegetables, cold storage, storage 33 infrastructure, transportation or other purposes as recommended by the council and 34 determined by the department that will help to establish a more efficient and effective supply chain of emergency food assistance resources. 6. Administration. The department shall administer the program. In administering
the program, the department shall consider the recommendations submitted by the council
or the committee pursuant to subsection 4 but is not bound to take any action in response
to these recommendations. The department shall administer the program through the use
of private sector partners selected by issuing and broadly publicizing competitive requests
for proposals. Requests for proposals may be used for, but are not limited to, purchase of
physical assets for storage, infrastructure and transportation, programmatic
recommendations and contracts with farmers in the State to grow certain volumes of
produce.'

10 SUMMARY

This amendment changes administration of the proposed Let's Grow Maine Program from the Finance Authority of Maine to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, deletes provisions increasing taxes on certain tobacco products and provides funding for the program from Temporary Assistance for Needy Families block grant funds.
